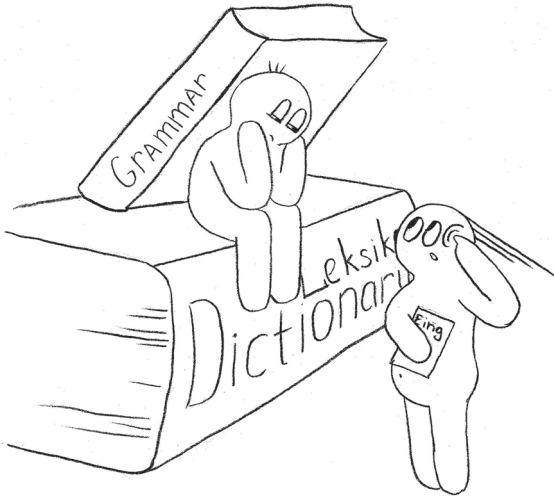

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Espering is an universal language that is a simple and easy language with no grammar at all and based on extremely simplified English. It has only 9 simplest rules, and almost half of the planet's population that know English to varying degrees will easily understand those that speak Espering. And all together will talk to each other.

Here you will also find the world's shortest language lesson- a lesson of Espering- and 2.100 word English-Espering-English dictionaries-notepads, enabling to complement them. As separate publications, there is a 1.900 word English-Espering phrasebook for travelers and will be a book called "About Espering from Everywhere... for Curious Minds" that will contain many interesting facts about the universal language: from brief notes and feedback on the language to funny short stories, original alphabetic-vocabulary novellas, and interesting translations to cater to various tastes and with about 230 witty drawings-illustrations (translation of these books into other world languages is pending).

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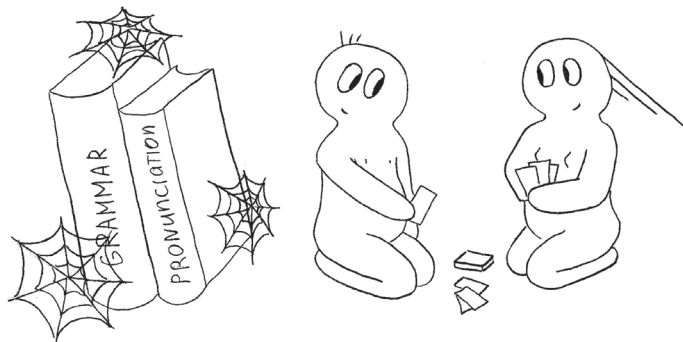

And the sound "i" is not too soft; however, it is not fundamentally significant, it simply sounds "more beautiful" this way.

Particular differences between words in Espering as compared to English? There are only 29 words), for example: aktual - in English, it is the word "actual", but...

[ˈaktʃuəl or ˈæktʃuəl]- here, the difference is not considered particular for an Espering word, first of all, with its spelling almost exactly the same as English, and its pronunciation that is very close to the international pronunciation of this word.

It is the other way around, the English word "actual" sounds pretty "particular"...

priti- pretty. In this example, Espering is indeed an innocent victim: the word is spelt exactly as it sounds, which is an obvious advantage and even its beauty, but the spelling of the English word decided that it is pretty to "stand out"...

Another example: many people that don't speak English will understand the Espering word "anons" - (it is similar to the French, German, and Esperanto word; it is quite similar to its Spanish and Italian equivalent), which is different from the English pronunciation [əˈnaʊns], even though the word is spelt as... announce.

But, here is a doubtful example:

avantur - adventure [ədˈvɛntʃə]. Again, the English word was borrowed from Latin and its pronunciation remained close to the original Latin. However, in Espering, the word "avantur" is closer to the commonly used international version of this word, both in terms of spelling and pronunciation.

Some examples are more illustrative, others are less so, but this fact remains: words "edvenche-enauns-ekchuel" and

the like have no place in a truly universal language. They will be impossible to learn for half the population of this planet. Anyone, including English speaking people, would agree that it is much easier to use words that sound like this: avantur-anons-aktual and are spelt like this: avantur-anons-aktual, and priti fits this category, too.

When comparing words in Espering and in English, do not forget about the English transcription- one of the three components of English, besides spelling and pronunciation. Behold! It's the Triple Face Language!

Another point: at the high level of using Espering, i.e. on the border of either speaking English fluently or at least knowing specialized terminology from borrowed foreign words- for example: determined, determine, determinant, determinism, etc. (even in the more down to earth variant of these words, the English "determine" in the meaning of "establish"), which allows for a myriad of other words with all these endings -ation, -ant, -ed, -ing, -ism, -istic, -ate, -able, -acy... wow, there is so many of them!- Espering gives everyone just one (1!) word, i.e. the primary core word for all those other 10 words with all those meanings.

When a word is used in a phrase, its whole meaning (context) gives this word the necessary meaning.

It would be too much to expect the majority of the world's population that does not speak English to memorize all those words. At the same time, those willing and able can at least use the word "determineyshen", which is easier than learning the word "determination" along with the English grammar and the entire English language on top of it.

Not to mention the more simple variants of some of the cumbersome words, for example: the English words "determined" and "resolute" are "rezolut" in Espering; even "strong" both in English and in Espering, and other words.

Let us emphasize this: all these simplifications are vitally important and necessary for a language that is truly universal, a language to be used by ALL people at different levels, based on the English language that is known to a third, if not half, of the world's population.

Explanations of peculiarities in Espering dictionaries e.g.:

ebaut or about,

'ekyuret, 'akyurat or akur'at,

'ekchuel or aktu'al, or...

It is truly amazing: can the spelling of English words really be so different from how these words are phonetically pronounced!?! In essence, Espering is the phonetic spoken version of the English language!

It is a language that follows the transcription of English words using the simple letters of its alphabet.

And even in terms of spelling, Espering often compares favorably with English. You can make the comparison for yourselves using this dictionary.

One is immediately struck by the difference between English and Espering dictionaries- where there is a difference, because many words are simply identical.

So, what's the matter?!

First of all, the following 3 letters of the English alphabet are not even included in the Espering alphabet:

Qq, Ww, and Xx.

Words that start with these letters in the English language fall in the corresponding K k and V v categories. The letter Cc at the beginning of words remains only in the Ch, ch combination, and all words that start with this letter in the English language when it sounds like [k], [s], etc.- fall into the K k, S s, etc. categories. And that is so much more logical!

And all the other first letters in English words that can be pronounced in different ways (**a** as [æ] or [eɪ]; **u** as [ʌ]; **e** as [ɪ]; **i** as [aɪ]...- there is quite a few of them- resulted in these words migrating into the categories of their first "sounding" letters.

So, get ready to use your fingers to count.

A a

In Espering, this letter's category also includes, naturally, the words that start with U, which in English sounds like [ʌ], besides [u] and [ju]- it is about 10 words. The English letter E has also lost a couple words to the Espering letter A. Even a few words from the English letter O category is also with the Espering letter A: for example, "outrage"; in Espering this word is pronounced and spelt in the exact same way "autreyj" (it is almost identical to the English transcription ['aʊtreɪdʒ]!

The time has come for the English word "hour" ['aʊə(r)], which has moved (left forward) to the Espering letter A category: *auer*.

But let me tell you this: from the English letter A, which is pronounced as the sounds [æ *and* eɪ]- you are not going to believe this!- only 75 words were ready to move to the Espering... letter E category...

(and that's in a 25,000-word dictionary).

Although... it would seem that they perhaps might remain where they are because the first letter "a" is often close in pronunciation to... [a] and [e]- it is something in between these two sounds, a somewhat indistinct [ə] - it is definitely not eEEE, and it is certainly not aAAA.

Some compare [ə] with... [ɜ:], for example: *girl* [gɜ:(r)l]. Well, in this word, the letter **g** is also not read in accordance with the rules: it should be pronounced as [dʒɜ:(r)l]- plus, the letter "i" is not our letter "a" either.

But, in the end, we needed to start our Espering dictionary one way or another, and, naturally, we began with the letter Aa. And, of course, we began with the words starting with Aa. And, since in Espering words are pronounced exactly how they are spelt, the beginning sound in these words will be the sound [a *or* ʌ].

But what are we going to do with the words that in English start with the sound... [ə]?

Besides, the English word "academy" [ə'ka(æ)dəmi] will definitely not be pronounced by most people

as [ɜ:'ka(æ)dəmi]...

A lot more frequently, the sound [ə] sounds like [e]. That is why there are these 75 "deserters" that moved from the letter A to the letter E. Interestingly enough... some of these words continue to "protest"; they simply do not want to sound like e, and that's that. For example, that very English word "academy" sounds strange in this variant as well:

ekademi.

But, in all the leading languages- from Latin to Esperanto- this word begins with the sound **a**- akademi... Thus, from the point of view of a truly global universal language, the Espering word "akademia" is the best choice (it is similar to this word in Hungarian, Polish, German, Indonesian, as well as Danish, Creole, Malay, Norwegian and other languages).

And, does it make any sense to include such words in the universal language: "edres, ekchuel, ekyuret", and even "ektiv"- do you recognize them?

These are the English words "address, actual, accurate *and* active"... No, Espering will include only "adres, actual, akurat *and* aktiv", and with variations as to the word stress (remember, in Espering there is no such thing as "incorrect!").

There are quite a few of such "A-E protesters" among the 75 words: about... all!

Their spelling would remain unchanged- similar to both the English and the "universal" spelling. But, their English pronunciation would slightly change...

That is why many words returned to their form, for example: the English word "about", which became the Espering "ebaut", realized that it has become too different from its reflection in the English language mirror and turned into "about". However, it is free to roam between the letters A and E: whichever way you pronounce this word, it is easily understood by the listener.

In this way, Espering shows a great example of language flexibility, which is so convenient in the already widely spread universal language. There is no way around it. Firmly sitting on the shoulders of the English language, Espering is ready to begin its confident march around the planet.

So, what's to be done? What can be done? No sooner do you straighten out the spelling than the pronunciation gets all messed up.

Once you pick up your pen to write a word down, your tongue can't seem to move right to pronounce it. And when you wrap your tongue around the word, your pen is on the floor and out of reach. When your hand is firm, your ear is deaf. When your hand is unsteady, your ear seems to hear better.

Let's settle it this way: we all will need to speak Espering and to hear it spoken, therefore, all the privileges should be given to the tongue and the ear. Especially because...

Those that never dealt with some strange peculiarities of the English language will be surprised to learn that a dozen English words starting with the letter A have moved to... the O category in the Espering dictionary.

How come!? - they will say.

Take the English word "always"...

How do you think it is pronounced?

You may find it hard to believe, but it sounds like this: olveyz, ['ɔ:lweɪz]. This awful English language! By the way, this word "awful" is pronounced in the same way it is spelt in Espering: oful, ['ɔ:fʊl].

And, it is the same in other examples, as well: "ande" (e-ing) from "under" ['ʌndə] (engl). Well, it couldn't possibly be "unde" ['undə], could it now?

However... on the other hand, take the English word "approve", for example, which in Espering is "apruv"; even if it was "appruve" in Espering, it would still be different from the English word "approve"... but [ə'pru:v].

Just think about it: when people that do not (!) speak English hear the word "ə'pru:v", they are more likely to go to the letter E or- alas!- to the letter A in the dictionary of Espering for their native language.

And, what about English-speaking people? They should not forget that they are dealing with the Espering (!)-English dictionary, where Espering words are closer to how English words are pronounced phonetically, and... do as everybody else!

And Espering is not avid: the English word "avid", which sounds like "evid"- with stress on its first letter!- remained with the Espering letter E- evid. Great ability was also displayed by the word "able", which in Espering became even more talented in the form of eybl- thus including both the English spelling, transcription, and pronunciation; one can say that the three areas are combined in it.

Oh, well... let all these words end up there. It is a good thing that you too shuffled your feet at the English language crossroads, especially during the season of badly muddy grammar roads.

E e

For those who only just begin to study the English language it comes as yet another shocking surprise that the English letter E is not E[e], but rather... I[ɪ].

How can it be? The letter E is the first one in the word "emblem", and there are also such words, albeit with some peculiarities, as "episode", "epithet", "epic", "epos"... Perhaps, the word "erotic" - I just haven't had the time to study this word more closely... But, the word "epoch" as pronounced as... ['i:pɒk]. Well, let me look up the word "erot..." - I knew it, it is "erotic" and it is pronounced as... [ɪ'rɒtɪk], with the sound [ɪ].

Still, one fifth of all the pages in the English dictionary listing words that start with the letter E contain the words that are pronounced starting with the sound [e].

But, there are also some peculiar words where the first letter is pronounced as "u", "i (ai)" and even "o", which only makes this phonetic confusion and chaos worse.

Of the 7.5 pages of words in the English dictionary that start with "ex-", less than half of the words (3 pages!) begin with the sound "e". The pronunciation of the rest of the words starts with the sound "i". So, what's to be done? It seems (or rather, it sounds like!) one must take into consideration the fact that people that do not speak English may pronounce an Espering word beginning with "eks-" and not "iks-" in a way that may make it less recognizable for English-speaking people.

It is all exactly the opposite in writing: so, the incorrectly written "ekspend" (or in any way 'ekspend) looks more like the English "expend" in writing, but not in terms of pronunciation!

But, the correctly written Espering "ikspend" (even if it is 'iksp'end) is closer in pronunciation to the English "expend".

Again, we are faced with this question: what are we to give priority to? Should it be the hand that writes, or the ear that hears? As we already decided earlier: it is the ear!

And, as we also agreed before: voice, speech, and hearing all play the key roles, while the mute hand, pen or keyboard, paper or screen are but background extras with non-speaking parts.

However, what remains is the fundamental premise of Espering that language is flexible and there is no such notion as "incorrect": the English word "example" sounds like this: igza(e)mpl [ɪg'zɑ:(æ)mp(ə)l]. In the "sound-based" spoken universal Espering, this word will naturally start with the sound "i" or... "e". Thus, we have the Espering word ikzempl or... ikzempl!

And, of course, ekzempl, too!.. (By the way, the sound "g" puts too much stress on your voice.)

It is a great example of how a letter-sound cannot distort a word. And, the English is a true champion in that!

It's not for no reason that Americans often prefer [eks] and the British prefer [iks].

As to the familiar international pronunciation of foreign words that were originally derived from Latin: exam, excess, excise, excursion, execution, exemplar, experiment, exploitation, express, extract, extreme... - Espering encourages this as well. The important thing is for the speaker and the listener to understand each other.

O o

The letter O lost some words to the letter A (for example "owl", which sounds as [aʊl]).

The English word "oven" pronounced as ['ʌvən] fled that way, too... It was followed by an onion rolling after it pronounced as ['ʌnjən]... The word "oust" pronounced [aʊst]

was also ousted. In the same way, out went the English word "out" pronounced ['aʊt].

Along with them went about half a dozen words to the very end of the dictionary, all the way to the letter... V, for example: engl. "one" [wʌn]... no use looking for it under the letter O; in Espering, you will find it under the letter V as "van".

Ii and Uu

The negative prefixes il-, im-, and ir- each had only half a page in the dictionary; the prefix un-, however, takes no less than 8 of the 10.5 pages of the letter U. All these prefixes are used to express the negative meaning of a word.

In Espering, they are all replaced with no- preceding a word.

The letter U street is all abuzz with festivities!

The happy slogans are "**u**niversal Espering!", "Espering- **u**tiliti fo ol!" (engl. "the **u**niversal Espering!", "Espering is **u**seful for all!").

And, there were also all those in- prefixes; you won't believe it... almost 10 pages of them! Let me tell you, the rules for using them correctly are as complex as advanced math... I mean grammar!

The consonants are all ... in agreement with this new order of things.

The English word "knight" in the meaning of "cavalier" and the chess term "courser" is now "najt (or nait)" in Espering. It is in the good company of such words as knock, knowledge, knee, knot, knob...

Espering got quite a few bumps and bruises transforming English this way and that way, and every which way.

Now, we can say that the great migration has occurred

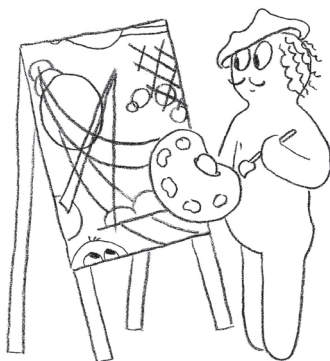
in the land of the Espering dictionary!

It is, however, only truly great in this particular dictionary of Espering and the foreign language in the parts where we have all those former English letters giving us multiple different sounds.

It is not all that significant in the body (in the middle) of dictionaries, nor in texts written in Espering.

So, when people that know English look for an English word they know in an Espering dictionary, they should be guided not so much by the word's spelling, but rather by its pronunciation, its simplified pronunciation. That means that they need to search for this word... by ear!

How else can one untangle all the various knots and twists of the English language- with its grammar, pronunciation and spelling- and not get all bumped and bruised in the process?!



Yeah... it is no easy task:
start with the English
language of Picasso
and end up with Espering
worthy of Rafael...
or Rembrandt.

Oh, this English language!
But, think about this:

without 30-40% (almost one half!) of the world's population speaking English, Espering would stand no chance of spreading throughout the entire planet's population! For this unprecedented potential alone- there is no other such language in the history of the world!- one can forgive Espering all its minor shortcomings and imperfections inherited from the English language.

No, not even all the "English-born" shortcomings put together will outweigh its advantages. As to its own unique shortcoming, there are no more of them in Espering than in any other language.

A little more about a vexed but topical vocabulary issue.

What should be surprising is not the fact that there are so many differences in languages, but rather the fact that they are often similar, or even identical. And, if we are talking about English... naturally, it is paired with no other existing language but Espering.

For example: enjoy- enjoy! That is in terms of word spelling.

And pronunciation-wise it is the same:

advantij and [əd'vɑ:ntɪdʒ] (advantage).

But with additional meaning, there are 65 pairs or trios (a total of 136) of words. i.e. words with identical spelling, but with similar or also identical English pronunciation because Espering is "in tune" with English, in which words spelt differently sound similar, which is reflected in Espering in their identical spelling, as well (most of such words start with b and s).

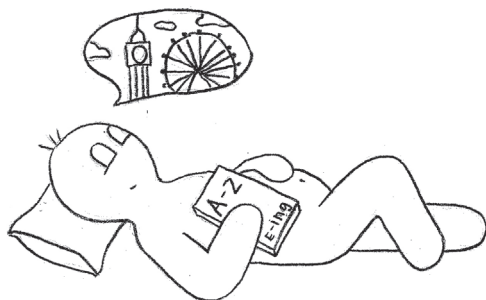
Thus, Espering seemingly "exacerbates" the problem. In English, at least the spelling is different, but in Espering both the spelling and the pronunciation of words is the same... But, the context and the meaning of phrases makes everything clear. Besides, with other words things are exactly the opposite.

Ultimately, due to such contextual "sorting out", it is easier to remember several words with identical spelling and pronunciation, as is the case in Espering, than memorize the strange spelling of the same English words, for example: weight, thought... Not to mention a host of such words not included in this list.

English words with similar or identical pronunciation, or simply words that are difficult to pronounce already create problems in spoken speech that put a strain on the context; plus, there is the additional issue of the difficult English spelling. It is all the original root-cause problem of the English language, like little children complain:

"he started it first".

In the end, Espering simplifies both the pronunciation and spelling, remaining a language that is very close to English- with all its shortcomings, but also all its advantages.

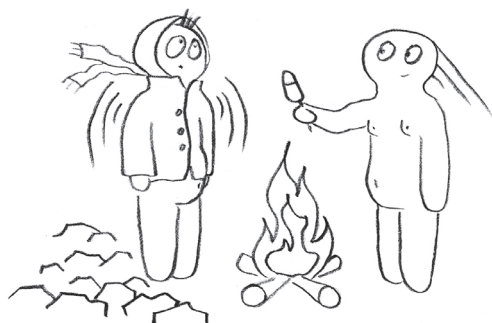

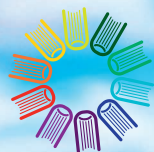
